

NEW YORK STATE MARIJUANA LAWS

AS OF MARCH 31ST, 2021

Established under the New York State Cannabis Control Board under the Marijuana Regulation and Taxation Act

WHAT DOES LEGALIZATION MEAN?

Adults ages 21 and over are allowed to possess up to 3 ounces (85 g) of cannabis, or 0.85 ounces (24 g) of concentrated cannabis.



At home, people will be permitted to store up to five pounds of cannabis, but they will have to take "reasonable steps" to make sure it is stored in a secure place.



Marijuana is not subject to forfeiture.



An officer is not allowed to use the smell of cannabis as justification to stop and search a pedestrian.

It remains illegal to drive under the influence of marijuana. An officer can use the smell of burned cannabis as a reason to pull them over, but they are only allowed to search what is readily available to the driver.

WHERE IS MARIJUANA ALLOWED?



Public smoking of cannabis is allowed wherever cigarette smoking is permissible.



Smoking cannabis is not permitted in schools, workplaces, public parks or in a car.

WHAT ARE THE NEW PENATIES?

Smoking publicly where it is not permitted will subject people to a civil penalty of \$25 or up to 20 hours of community service.

No fine for people giving to those 21 and up without compensation. Sale in any mount to anyone 18 and under is a class D felony with up to 7 years of imprisonment.

Possession of marijuana in **excess of 3 oz is a class A misdemeanor** and is punishable by no more than 1 year of imprisonment and a fine not to exceed \$1,000; **8 oz-16 oz a class E felony** and is punishable by no more than 4 years of imprisonment and a fine not to exceed \$5,000. Possession of marijuana in excess of **16 oz-10 lbs** is a class D felony and is punishable by no more than 7 years of imprisonment and a fine not to exceed \$5,000. Possession excess of 10 lbs is a class C felony and is punishable by no more than 15 years of imprisonment and a fine not to exceed \$15,000.
